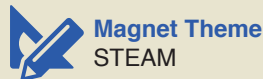
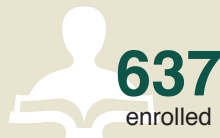


Project Overview

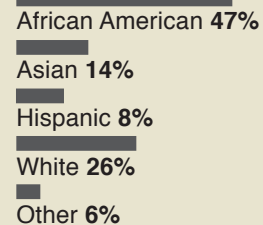
Champaign Community Unit School District #4 is significantly revising two elementary magnet schools and converting a middle school from a traditional program to a whole-school magnet program. The Magnet Schools Assistance Program (MSAP)-funded project is providing rigorous, theme-based instruction that expands school choice, promotes diversity, and ensures that all students are college and career ready. Extensive professional development enables educators to collaborate across subject areas and grade levels to develop engaging theme-based learning experiences using evidence-based practices. 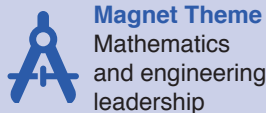

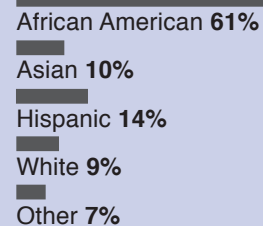

Garden Hills Elementary

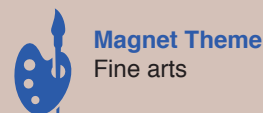
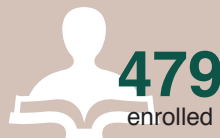

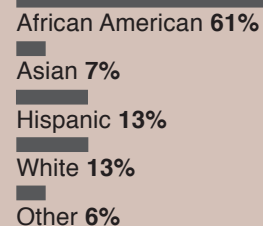
