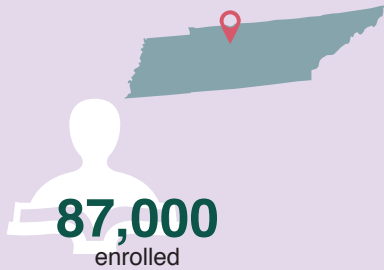
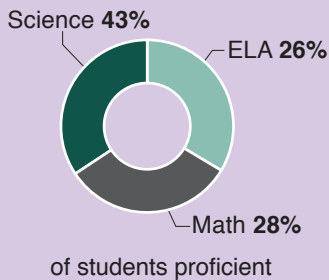
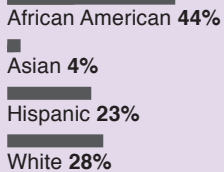

Project Overview

Metropolitan Nashville Public Schools is converting five elementary schools from traditional programs to whole-school magnet programs with science, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics (STEAM)-related themes. The Magnet Schools Assistance Program (MSAP)-funded project is reducing minority group isolation; ensuring that all students meet challenging academic standards, benefit from the magnet program's theme-based instruction, and have equal opportunities to gain value-added skills and knowledge; and building teachers' capacity to provide rigorous, theme- and evidence-based instructional programs that promote choice and diversity. The MSAP project revitalizes teaching and learning at each school, makes the schools more attractive to diverse students and families, and partners with educational organizations to provide specific expertise in instructional practices.

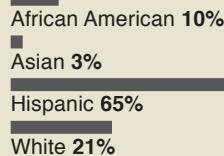
